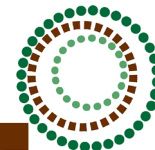

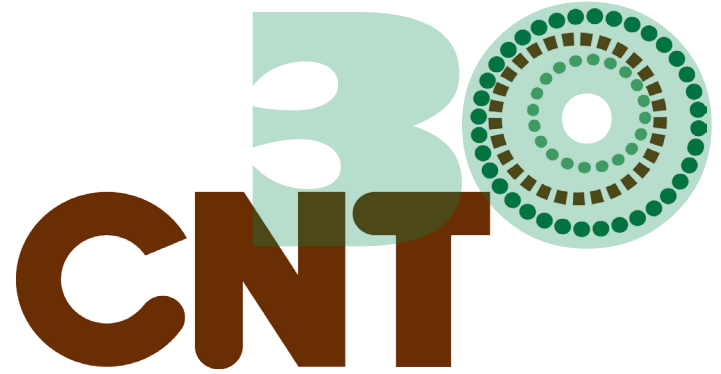
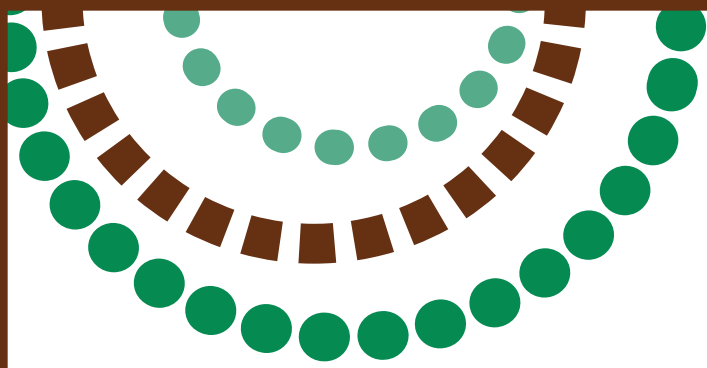

## About CNT

CNT has been working since 1978 to show urban communities in Chicago and across the country how to develop more sustainably.

By sustainably, we mean in a way that's good for the economy and the environment; makes better use of existing resources and community assets; and improves the health of natural systems and the wealth of people—today and in the future.

Imagine a think tank crossed with an incubator. That's how we work. While we often do complex research and analysis, it's applying what we know for the benefit of real neighborhoods and people, especially those most in need, that drives us. Sometimes we work to change markets, other times public policies—often times both.

CNT develops innovative projects that promote sustainable regions and communities, including the **Housing + Transportation Affordability Index**, a new and more comprehensive way of thinking about “affordability” by exploring the impact that transportation costs associated with the location of housing have on a household's economic bottom line; **I-GO<sup>SM</sup> car sharing**, which serves the Chicago region with economical and environmentally sound transportation choices; **Real-time Electricity Pricing Program** for residential customers, which was invented and developed by CNT and now implemented in Illinois and Toronto; and the **Green Values Stormwater Tool Box**, which advances green stormwater management.

CNT practices sustainable development “at home” in our LEED-certified Platinum building and works with national and international partners to advance sustainable programs, including involvement with the **Clinton Foundation's** climate work, the **City of Chicago's Climate Action Plan**, and the **Presidential Climate Action Project**; and a native prairie garden dedication by **Kenyan Nobel Peace Prize laureate Wangari Maathai**, founder of the Green Belt Movement.
